#### **PACKED LUNCHES & BREAKTIME SNACKS**

In school where possible we try to encourage and promote healthy eating habits. Please could we politely ask that those parents and carers who provide packed lunches for their children, aim to make these as healthy as possible. We recognise that many of you already do this and would like to thank you for this, but in some cases, we have recently noticed an increase in the number of unhealthy items some children bring for their lunch. Research shows that nutritious lunches support children's learning and overall well-being, so we would really appreciate your cooperation with this matter.

To maintain alignment with food standards set for school meals and ensure consistency, we kindly ask that packed lunches <u>do not</u> contain the following restricted items:

- Chocolate bars, sweets, or confectionery
  - Chocolate desserts e.g. pots of joy
    - Sugared or toffee popcorn
- Crisps that are high in salt and fat (usually labelled red using the food traffic light system)
  - Fizzy or sugary drinks in cartons, bottles, or cans
  - Glass thermos flasks or glass containers (due to health and safety reasons)

Additionally, please be mindful of nut allergies that may affect other children. Please check that there are no nuts in any products you send in.

Breaktime snacks must also be healthy e.g. fruit, bread sticks etc and not chocolate bars, sausage rolls, sweets, cakes, biscuits etc.

Thank you for your understanding and support in fostering a healthy eating environment for our children - we really appreciate it!





#### **WATERBOTTLES**

Please send your child to school each day with a water bottle containing **water only**. These can be refilled across the day. Water is also provided on the lunch tables for all pupils (school meals and packed lunches).






# Kindness Grows: A Peek-through Picture Book by Britta Teckentrup (Paperback) Britta Teckentrup (author)

#### We're All Wonders (Paperback) R J Palacio (author/illustrator)


I know I can't change the way I look. But maybe, just maybe, people can change the way they see
